## Background:

This is a report on the Board's Probation Monitoring Program for the third quarter of FY 2022-2023. Please refer to attachment 13(a), which encompasses the probation statistics for FY 2022-2023.

## Analysis:

In quarter 3, the Osteopathic Medical Board of California had a total of thirty-four (34) probationers who were placed on probation for various causes. Of these 34 probationers, eight (8) were tolling out of state and not receiving credit towards the completion of probation. One licensee was placed on probation in the quarter, and zero licensees completed probation.

Of the 34 licensees on probation and not tolling, four were participating in the Board's Diversion Program, MAXIMUS. MAXIMUS reported one issue of non-compliance of one of their participants for the quarter. This participant failed to properly submit their biological fluid testing sample for the month of January. MAXIMUS remediated the issue of non-compliance by requiring the participant to submit an essay detailing the actions and steps they will take to avoid the issue in the future.

Two participants successfully completed the MAXIMUS program in January but will remain on probation with the Board until their probationary terms expire.
